



## THE EYE QUIZ TOURNAMENT IN YOUR HIGH SCHOOL!

### What is the EYE Quiz Tournament (EQT)?

The [EYE Quiz Tournament](#) (EQT) is an international competition among university and high school students living in the European Union, where participants answer questions about various topics related to the EU. It aims to **strengthen European citizenship among young people** by **increasing their knowledge of the EU** and raising awareness about how the EU Agenda impacts their daily life.

While interviewing students from our network of colleges on the **root causes of the lack of democratic participation among young people**, one of their main concerns was **lack of civic education on the European Union in high school and university curricula**. With our project we want to give our contribution to fill this gap. Through the use of gamification as a non-formal education tool, we want to **increase the interest in learning EU civic education** and make learning more interactive and engaging for young people.

The EQT is an activity part of the [European Youth Event](#) (EYE), it is organised by the European university college Association, and it is co-funded by the European Parliament. The EQT first phase was held online on Twitch, while the second phase took place at the European Parliament in Strasbourg during the EYE 2023. Since April, the project has involved **450 university students from all over Europe** and welcomed the



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presence of **11 Members of the European Parliament** as special guests during our activity in the **EYE2023 in Strasbourg**.

We are now launching the last phase: we will involve **10 High Schools from different European countries** to organise the EYE Quiz Tournament among their students **and the amazing prize for the 10 winners** will be a **trip to the European Parliament in Brussels** on **28 November 2023**.

### **Bring the EQT in Your High School!**

Do you want to be among the 10 High Schools who will give the amazing opportunity to their students to compete in the EQT ?

EucA will support you throughout the entire organisation of the Tournament! We will provide you with:

- The **access to the platform “[Quizziz](#)”** where you will find **all the quizzes to use for the tournament**. Each quiz is made of 10 Questions with multiple answers. You will need a projector to show the question to the students and through the use of a code each student will be able to answer the question by using a smartphone.
- Access to **training material on the App [Action Bound](#)**. There is no need to study in books to be ready for the tournament! Students will be able to train on their smartphone, since the 500 questions used for the quizzes will be available for practicing on Action Bound. Every question is linked to an explanation. Questions are divided into 5 different topics: “How is the EU relevant to your daily life?”; “How Does the EU work?”; “How does the European Parliament work?”; “What’s on the EU Agenda”; “How can citizens engage at the EU level?”.
- **EucA staff will support you** remotely in the implementation of the EQT and will be always available to answer any questions or doubts you may have.



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## Step-by-step - What do we need from you?

- **Express your interest** to organise the EQT in your High School **and register by filling this [Google form](#)** before **15 October 2023**.
- Choose **30 students** to be involved in the EQT and **share** with them the **Action Bound training material**. You can freely select the students! A minimum level of **English B2** is required.
- Choose **a presenter** who will read the question and the explanations, and will lead the tournament. It can be a professor or a student. A minimum level of **English B2** is required.
- Choose the best way to **organise your EQT**: it might be arranged as a **one-day competition** or during **multiple days**. The Tournament must be organised in the week [between Monday, 23 October and Tuesday, 31 October](#).
- The competition will be divided into 4 rounds where students individually will compete in matches. **The time needed to implement the tournament is 5 hours in total**.
- Follow the format and the **brackets** EuCA provided you with, and start your competition!
- Take **pictures and videos** of your EQT to share with EuCA; It is important to take pictures or record videos of the EQT to have concrete evidence of your event.
- Send us a list of the students who participated in the EQT.
- **Crown your EQT winner!**

## How does the Competition work?



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Duration of the match: 20 minutes

Number of questions for each match: 10

Number of students involved in one match: 5

Who wins the match and passes to the following round? The students with the highest scores for each match (scores are automatically assigned by the platform Quizziz). Additionally, the 2 participants with the highest scores among the second places will also pass to the following round.

First round: 6 matches

Second round: 4 matches

Semi-Final: 2 matches

Final: 1 match

Modality: Questions are shown on a screen. A presenter will read the question and the answers and participants will use their smartphone to answer the questions. The score depends on the speed in answering and whether the participants answer correctly or incorrectly. The presenter reveals the correct answer and reads the explanation. After the last question, the presenter shows the scoreboard and crowns the winner of the match.

### **Awarding ceremony**

There will be one winner for each of the 10 High Schools. The 10 winners will fly to Brussels to participate in the **EQT awarding ceremony** taking place at the European Parliament. EuCA will pay for: the transportation tickets for the winner, 2-nights accommodation and 1 dinner.

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The European university college Association (EuCA) is a non-profit organisation based in Brussels, representing University Colleges and networks of Colleges in Europe. EuCA aim is to enrich students' academic and professional development through non-formal and informal activities in employability, soft skills, international mobility and responsible citizenship.
