CoR Model Simulation:

What is it?

The European Committee of the Regions (CoR) is the European Union's assembly of local and regional representatives, providing sub-national authorities a direct voice in EU policy.

Established in 1994, it ensures local perspectives are considered in EU legislation. As an advisory body, the Committee provides opinions on EU legislation to the European Commission, Parliament, and Council. It focuses on strengthening cohesion, resilience, and proximity between the EU and its citizens.

What will you do?

At VOICES fifth event, you will have the chance to represent your region and offer local perspectives on integration. The simulation will function as a direct parallel to the simultaneous International Conference, where the Municipality of Rosarno and other 16 towns will adopt the ***Local Action Plan Against Racism and for Integration*** based on the policy recommendations you drafted during the first phase of this project.

This is a chance to step into the role of local decision-makers and experience first-hand how regional interests, political priorities, and social realities shape public debate. The simulation aims to strengthen your understanding of multilevel governance, foster policy-writing and public-speaking skills, and encourage critical reflection on how anti-racism measures can be effectively implemented at the local level.

What will you take home?

The program bridges the gap between youth participation and institutional processes, allowing you to not only formulate recommendations but to test them in realistic settings. By recreating the dynamics of the Committee of the Regions, you will discover the **importance of local authorities** in shaping communities while also learning to see yourself as an **active contributor** to policy development.
